What has been happening in our parish.

The past couple of months have been very busy in our parish.

We have celebrated Confirmations for 48 children and First Holy Communion for 45 children. We have celebrated 10 baptisms. We had 8 couples receive a special Blessing for Significant Anniversaries.

We have walked with 2 families as they farewelled loved ones at Funeral services. We celebrated Fathers Day We acknowledged Safeguarding Sunday, and celebrate the fact that we are a parish that everyone is able to feel safe when they are involved.

We have worked through a Parish renewal, by updating census, ministry and Planned Giving opportunities.

The PPC have worked through the Diocesan Assembly feedback and prepared responses for the Archdiocese, with help from parishioners. We have celebrated Migrant & Refugee Sunday we have people from many different countries making up our community. We have 22 children preparing to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation later this month.

And James Thomson from our parish was Ordained a Deacon.

All of these things on top of our regular Sunday celebrations and parish meetings.

<u>Liturgy Room</u>

Over the past couple of months I have been cleaning out and trying to organise the liturgy room behind the Altar.

The room was completely emptied, cleaned and scrubbed and repainted. The curtain was washed and repaired, and storage shelves purchased. I have washed and repaired, photographed and am now cataloguing our banners. I have found approx. 40 banners (some of which I had never seen before). I am trying to use the banners when appropriate, so you will have seen banners more often around the church. Living our Mission-Strategic Plan 2022-2025

Over the past 2 years our parish has worked extremely hard to develop our Strategic Plan. This plan is has now been completed and will be presented to the community very soon.

The plan was formulated through the process of renewal and reflection undertaken by our Parishioners, School Community and PPC with input

from the wider Hallett Cove community ... St Martin de Porres Parish is a Catholic Community enriched by and centred on the Eucharist, empowered to bring the Good News to all. Our Community agreed upon 3 very important themes of Ministry, Community and Liturgy.

This is a living plan and will be continuously updated as progress is made on the initiatives.

The Diocesan Assembly

2021 Diocesan Assembly Feedback was discussed in small groups in July & August this year. After consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council members, the parishioners, members of the school staff and the Hallett Cove community, we completed our feedback on

the 2021 recommendations. Our top 3 Recommendations for our community and our top 3 Recommendations for the Archdiocese have been sent to the Archdiocese in readiness for the 2022 Assembly.

Top 3 Recommendations for our Community

1. Parish and Schools are encouraged to explore and investigate the opportunities "Being Church Together" document to enable us to continue to grow in being a Church Community together.

2. Make our churches places of celebration that are attractive to others be involved, be active, be proud, be hospitable - build connection and belonging.

3. Provide opportunities and resources for family faith formation, faith sharing and spiritual conversation in parishes and other ecclesial and school communities (e.g. Alpha, Neocatechumenal way, using media in contemporary ways)

Top 3 Recommendations for the Archdiocese:

- 1. Development and implementation of more inclusive liturgy practices. Inclusive liturgy recognising the richness. Mandating Acknowledgement of Country
- 2. Take every opportunity not to be gender driven in all ministries/roles within the Church. Time to address celibacy

3. Sharing resources between parishes and schools about engaging young people in church, especially 11 - 17 year olds

The Diocesan Assembly has enriched and complemented our Parish themes of Ministry, Community and Liturgy. The Parish theme of Ministry has much in common with the Diocesan theme of a Church that listens and responds to the Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor as well as Faith Formation and Spiritual Development.

The Parish theme of Community has much in common with the Diocesan themes of Inclusion, and Healing, Leadership and Leadership Formation and Outreach and accompaniment of children, families and young people.

The Parish theme of Liturgy has much in common with the Diocesan theme of Parish Life and Liturgy.

The renewal and reflection undertaken by our Parishioners, School Community and PPC with input from the wider Hallett Cove community has shaped our responses to the Diocesan Strategic Actions process. Members of our PPC are looking forward to attending the 2022 Assembly on Friday 21 October and Saturday

22 October. We look forward to sharing this information with the parish community on our return.

Searching for Parish Engagement Survey (SPES)

Our parish is involved in a special project in collaboration with Catholic Education Office and our neighbouring Catholic Schools, in conjunction with Leuven Catholic University in Belgium. This project will relate closely to one of our Parish strategies from 'Living our Mission' document. This strategy is a focus on families and how as a Parish we can develop engagement and connection and recognize the importance of our Catholic School in this. This project involves taking part in an online survey about parish and school identity and is known as Searching for Parish Engagement Survey (SPES). Every parishioner over 15 years old will be invited to complete this online survey indicating your views about parish life and your hopes for the future. Your views are extremely important in how you think our parish is going and what plans can be made for the future. The questions will focus on different aspects than what we have collected previously. You are asked to give 40 minutes of your time to complete the survey. All surveys are completely anonymous and your honest responses are welcomed.

School communities will also be completing these surveys. When we receive the results of these surveys we will have the opportunity to share the results of both school and parish.

Census Forms

We received 83 responses to our census forms (27 online and 55 on paper).

Some interesting facts to note:

- Only 12 families with children at home. 48 fully retired households
- 5 new families (not previously on our records)
- 3 major changes to our records ie address etc

Ministry Forms

Only 18 forms were completed, but on renewing the Ministry rosters I received many updates for Ministries.

College classmate of Branch Chairman Rod Roach.

Professor D'Assumpcao's talk was titled: Great and Powerful Friends - a brilliant perspective on Australia's position geographically and economically in the world, but more particularly in the Southeast Asia and South Pacific Regions. One important perspective focussed on the rise of China as a super power and the need for Australia to cope with the changing power plays in the region. It called for continued development of our defence technologies and good economic management, whilst maintaining a constructive dialogue with nations in the region. Professor D'Assumpcao was, amongst his many other eminent positions, Chief Scientist at the Weapons Research Establishment (now DSTO) here in SA so his talk was quite scholarly but, in an expert way, brilliantly tailored to suit his present audience. Your Vinnies group has continued to provide services and offer assistance during 2022 through the following ways:

• Continued with phone interviews (normally face to face) and provide food vouchers for use at Foodbank, food parcels, clothing, bedding, kitchenware and paying some utility accounts

• Two of our members have made another 12 month commitment to also assist the Vinnies Noarlunga group with face to face interviews

• Four of our members have made a further 12 month commitment to also assist the Vinnies Aberfoyle Park group

• We support Fred's Van Christies Beach both with monetary support and some food

- Five of our members assist with serving meals and other duties at Fred's Van Christies Beach
- We give monetary support to the Vinnies Refugee & Asylum Seeker Service
- Some members are supporting the Circle of Friends (111) group, who are placing refugee families in homes, help with attaining work etc, through regular donations
- All our members have committed to pack & deliver Christmas Hampers within our region then assist in packing hampers for two other southern groups

• We financially support two of our overseas Vinnies groups in India and Indonesia. Both groups operate in very poor areas & the Indonesian group is in a very remote area. Both groups have been hugely impacted by COVID

• We financially support Vinnies Assist a Student Program. The Assist a Student Program provides funding to support the education of a student in one of our Vinnies partner countries for one year. In many Asia Pacific countries, poverty is a barrier to accessing education and other opportunities and therefore excludes individuals from reaching their full potential One member has been overseeing the Bookshop for many years with ordering & collecting stock, theming the room to match the Liturgical Season & sourcing Calendars & Christmas cards.

Confirmation and First Holy Communion We have recently completed the preparation and ceremonies for Confirmation and First Holy Communion in our parish. Without a Pastoral worker, this process was made a little trickier. A huge thank you to Ben Ryan, APRIM at St Martin de Porres school for leading all the parent meetings and preparation sessions (twice a week) and playing music for the Confirmation ceremony and two of the First Holy Communion Masses. Fr Michael Confirmed 45 children at our ceremony in July. 3 Children were unable to make this ceremony due to COVID, so they were confirmed during our First Holy Communion Masses. Standing behind Fr Michael for the Confirmation rite was a stand out for me. I was close enough to see and hear the children when they were being confirmed. The joy and confidence and eagerness with their responses were a joy to witness. I was also amazed at Fr Michael's knowledge of the Saints, and some of the children picked some really unusual saints. Fr Michael had something to say to each child about their saint.

The First Holy Communions of these children were spread over 3 weekends at our usual Saturday and Sunday Masses in August and September. They were joyous celebrations and we hope to see a lot of them at Mass again.

We have a new group of children preparing for Reconciliation at the moment, approx. 22. They will celebrate this Sacrament in October with Confirmation and First Holy Communion next year.
