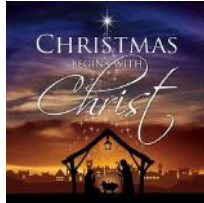

through us, to become genuinely free and joyfully fulfilled by being open to others in loving service. Holy orders is the Church's way of nurturing greater awareness

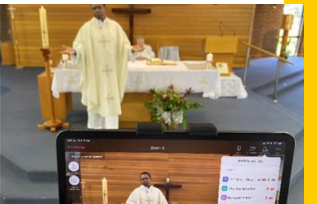


of this mystery of life, the profound gift we each received through baptism. From within

Parish Finance Council Update

2020 has been a challenging year with income under budget (12%) mainly due to the impact of COVID-19 and the limited number of parishioners at Masses on the weekend. Expenditure was also under budget (35%) as some salaries were subsidised by the federal governments Job keeper scheme. With net overall better than budget expectations. Even with COVID-19, excluding the sale of the land, the end of year result is on line to showing a positive result for 2020.

Fr Peter has been working with the Archdiocese and has relocated to Largs North where he grew up and is close to family as part of his retirement. A review of the Parish House and what work is required to ensure that we are able to support a resident priest will need to be undertaken in early 2021.

EAST TIMOR SEMINARIAN SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMME

The ET Sponsorship Programme Committee is pleased to inform our communities that, despite the reduced attendance at parish mass and reduced fund raising opportunities during this Covid year we have been able to maintain a healthy finance bank balance that enabled us to support 13 seminarians in each of the three Seminaries in East Timor. That is a total of 39 Seminarians.

In addition, we have also benefited from a much more favourable exchange rate for the Australian Dollar which meant that our commitment for 2020 sponsorship did not drain our finances as much as we had originally feared. This means that after the transfer of \$10277 to East Timor we have a balance at the end of November of \$11454. This will place our programme in a solid position to maintain a similar level of sponsorship in 2021.

We have also been pleased to watch the progress through the sponsorship programme of candidates especially Filipe Moniz who has now been ordained Deacon in Dili and Carlos Roben who has been continuing his seminarian studies in Rome and has now been ordained Deacon.

We had the pleasure of hosting Carlos and Filipe during their visit to our communities in October 2012. We remember them for their enthusiasm and vision for their future and that of their East Timor communities.

We invite our Parish communities to continue to donate to the sponsorship programme to maintain the financial support for the seminarians who progress through their studies in the Minor, Propaedeutic, and Major Seminaries in Dili to ultimately serve their communities as priests or any other chosen field of service.

The Brighton, Hallett Cove, St Anns and Glenelg Parishes sponsorship programme committee wish our communities a Blessed and safe Christmas and happy, healthy and safe New Year 2021.
