I was born on the 29th April, 1968 in Kenya. I am the 2nd last of 4 boys and 2 girls.


I was ordained as a Roman Catholic Priest on the 9th July, 2000 in the Archdiocese of Kigali, Rwanda.

I have a Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy and a Bachelor of Arts in Sacred Theology, Religious Studies from the University of Eastern Africa, in Nairobi, Kenya.

Whilst in Rwanda I served in 3 different parishes, after which I was sent to Barcelona in Spain to study for my Masters in Counselling Psychology. Returning back to Rwanda I was appointed to serve in the Psychiatric hospital sponsored by the Brothers of Charity as a psychologist and a chaplain, offering pastoral care and counselling to patients and hospital staff. I also taught Counselling Psychology to the novices of the Brothers of Charity, and teaching social studies and communication skills at St Vincent's Minor Seminary in Ndera, until the end of January, 2020.

I came to Australia on the 4th Feb, 2020, where I spent the first 6 months of transition in Adelaide. After 6 months I was appointed Assistant Parish Priest of St Pauls Catholic Church in Mt Gambier (part of the South Eastern Deanery). 2 months ago, I was appointed to Brighton & Hallett Cove parishes as Assistant Parish priest to Fr Michael.

Fr Dominick is interested to getting to know parishioners and talking to people and can offer advice if needed. His qualifications as a psychologist are not recognised by the Australian government, but he is willing to meet with and counsel in his role as Assistant priest. We received the following message after delivering a Christmas Hamper to a struggling family:

"Hi. I just wanted to say thank you so much for everything Vinnies gave us. I truly do love you guys. You are like a family to me & have always been there for me through my darkest times even when I have been close to suicide.

Words cannot describe how much you have made my day today as I got bad news from the doctors this week so I don't think I'll be here for another Christmas & I wouldn't have had any presents to give the kids. So I really, really appreciate it."

Other Activities

In early January some of our members shifted furniture from a deceased estate and delivered it to two refugee families. They couldn't stop smiling!

Three of our newer members are now assisting another Vinnies group in our region due to high demand for services. These members have made a generous commitment to support them this year.

Our group has also committed to support the Christies Beach Fred's Van & the Vinnies Refugee & Asylum Seeker Service. It's such a blessing that we are able, due to your ongoing support, to help the disadvantaged in our community and beyond.





**Items of interest from the meeting of 9th March
2021**

- An independent audit of the 2020 accounts was completed with no significant issues raised. The Auditor passed on their thanks for the excellent records kept by both Pat & Jenny. Final 2020 figures were better than budget showing a profit of \$38k primarily due to the sale of the Parish House Land.
- As we no longer have a loan repayment the 2020 budget is balanced. Staff cost are still a concern based on our current level of planned giving and will need to be reviewed. The school has committed to continuing their subsidy.
- I have agreed to continue in the Role of Chair for 2021 due to low numbers on the committee – we are seeking two (2) new members to help bolster the numbers. Terry Fanning has agreed to be the liaison with the Parish Pastoral Council and will attend the PPC meetings.
- Tony Barbaro tabled the Disasters Response Policy & Plan. Following some minor changes, Tony will present this at the next PPC meeting for sign off by Fr Michael & Helen Thompson. Signed copies will be provided to all council members and key stakeholders.
- In 2021 we need to look at Stewardship Renewal. Stewardship is not a one-time act of giving, but rather a way of life that encompasses not only our weekly envelope and other planned gifts, but also the generous sharing of our time and talents with the Church and community. The Parish Pastoral Council will be asked to consider how this program may be tailored in line with the Strategic Plan – possibly an August / September 2021 roll out in line with the release of the planned giving envelopes.
- Following funding from Church Office, the Parish House has been refurbished and Fr Dominick has now moved in. The total project cost was just over \$8k.

complete towards the end of the term.

Masses/ Community prayer

After the disruptions of 2020 we have returned to regular liturgical experiences for all students and have established a pattern of Mass in even weeks and community prayer in odd weeks. 6 classes will attend each Mass in the Church to remain under the numbers cap.



Staff formation

Staff have commenced the Alpha program and will participate in sessions throughout this year led by Ben Ryan. This program offers a forum to discuss how the Gospel message intersects with modern culture, and how this shapes our Catholic Identity.

Sacraments

The Sacrament program will recommence in early June, with 42 students starting their preparation for Confirmation and Holy Communion. We have two groups coming together after the cancellation of Sacrament programs in 2020. Once we have the dates for the Confirmation ceremonies locked in with the archdiocese, we will advise families of the dates.

Youth Ministry

Our youth ministry program has started the year with great enthusiasm, and we are fortunate to have Ineke Garton start as our new youth minister this year. Ineke hosts the social justice group called CIA (Compassion in Action) at lunchtime on Wednesdays, and this group has been focussed on raising money and awareness for project compassion.

Veritas, a night of friends, faith and fun on Wednesday nights, has also returned this year and continues to prove popular with students from years 4-7.

Caritas Fun Run

Eight Southern region schools are set to join SMDPS for the Caritas Fun Run on the 24 March at Seacliff Beach. The year 5 and 6 students will participate in a 6km run or 3km walk.

After Mass Gatherings



Uncontrolled eating has been proven to be unhealthy. There seems to be evidence that having periods of eating less gives the body a chance to recover and heal from certain health challenges. Jesus spoke about fasting being beneficial spiritually.

"We do not live on bread alone".

He spoke about combatting evil by prayer and fasting. Uncontrolled gratification can seriously distract us from a healthy, spiritual life.

St. Paul speaks about some people making Gods of their stomachs.

Healthy self-discipline is helpful for developing a life based on virtue.

Healthy balanced fasting can certainly be helpful in the spiritual journey.

However, the scriptures also speak of other forms of fasting.

Helping the poor. Looking after those in need.

Fasting from gossip.

Fasting from unhealthy sexual practices.

Visiting the lonely. Looking after refugees.

Being respectful. Helping the 'powerless'.

And so many other ways of going out of our comfort zone to help others.

Fasting without loving is not helpful. It is love that gives meaning to fasting.

Love is the most powerful way of practising self-discipline. It is called commitment.
