As we come to the end of the year, a quick update from the parish finance council. Most importantly thank you to our parishioners have given generously throughout the year, your support through the planned giving program is greatly appreciated. Thank you to all the members for the parish finance council who have contributed the time and talents throughout the year and special thanks to Mons Ian Dempsey who guided us through 2018.

Our five year strategic plan ends in 2019 with the Parish finances in a stable position, we have reduced the overall debt to \$100k and maintained a positive cash flow for the year.

There are a number of key maintenance projects that need to be included for future years including the roof, guttering, carpets and painting the outside of the church which all come at a cost.

With a change in leadership we have welcomed Fr Michael and we will work with him to present a responsible fiscal plan for the next few years.

Child Safe Environments Briefing for Volunteers

As you may be aware, all volunteers in our Archdiocese are mandated notifiers under the South Australian Child Protection Legislation. To ensure we hear the voices of children and have the necessary skills to identify and respond appropriately, we invite any volunteers who have not yet participated in Child Safe Environments training or an equivalent course to attend a 90 minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit. Please note that these briefings (or an equivalent course) are a compulsory requirement for anyone wishing to be a Eucharistic Minister.

A Volunteer Briefing will be held on:

Wednesday 6th February, 2019, 10am in the Brighton Activity Centre

Note: If you have attended a Child Safe Environments or RAN training within the past 3 years you do not need to attend a Volunteer Briefing
Thank you for agreeing to help us provide care and safety for our children and young people.

Police Check for Volunteers

It is the policy and practice of the Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide that individuals who have a responsibility through their role within the Archdiocese in either a paid or voluntary capacity, will be required to undergo a Department for Communities & Social Inclusion (DCSI) Working with Children screening which is processed through the Archdiocesan Police Check Unit. The screening process is completed on line and will require applicants have access to an email address.

General exemptions will include all children under 18 years of age. All volunteers 80 years and above who have previously received clearance from the Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide are exempted from renewal checks.

Please contact the parish office and bring 100 points of ID with you to arrange for a Police Clearance.

The story up to now

A Parish assembly was held in October 2016 to introduce the *Eight Gospel Pathways* to parishioners and to seek feedback. Based on this feedback, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) reviewed the *Eight Gospel Pathways* during each of its meetings throughout 2017. The PPC tasked a sub-committee to recommend renewal priorities, which the PPC endorsed in April 2018.

While steps were taken to implement some these recommendations, the PPC and Parish Leadership Team decided in late June 2018 to slightly delay a complete roll-out of implementation due to the impending change in parish priest in early September 2018. A review of implementation plans was planned after the new parish priest was in position for a few months (approximately November 2018).

2	Conduct 30-minute formation sessions after Mass (dates/times; proposed content)
3	Email ongoing formation material to proclaimers
4	Encourage proclaimers to consult <i>Break Open the Word</i> resource prior to assigned Mass
5	Include brief introduction to the upcoming Mass in Pat's weekly email
6	Facilitate a fortnightly Scripture Reflection Group (in addition to Advent and Lenten reflection groups)

#4 There is a warm sense of community outreach and welcome

Parish Goal—To encourage greater experiences of welcome for all those attending Mass

	Key Actions
1	Email <i>Eight Gospel Pathways</i> document to all involved in welcoming ministries (door greeters, tea & coffee; include cover letter)
2	Mail letter of acknowledgement to all involved in welcoming ministries
3	'Receiving a Warm Welcome at St Martin de Porres' (PPT slides before Mass; 4-5 short blurbs—each with an action step; repeat after Prayer after Communion)
4	'Welcome to St Martin de Porres Catholic Community' A4 trifold leaflet (update via feedback from parishioners)
5	Prepare leaflet for Christmas and Easter celebrations
6	Include leaflet with 'Welcome Pack' for families bringing children to be baptised

Your PPC and the Parish Leadership Team is currently working with Fr Michael towards a revised implementation plan of recommended renewal priorities. Some aspects of the current plan may be modified; you will be kept informed of developments. In any case, renewal is firstly a continual alignment of one's heart to Jesus and less a series of steps in a program. Please continue to pray that we will, individually and collectively, seek God's grace to give faithful expression to the Gospel and so remain a healthy, vibrant, renewing parish.

Vinnies

As Christmas approaches, your Vinnies Conference enters its most busy time of the year. We are now selling the latest Vinnies Christmas cards and the Columban calendars through the bookshop, which we also operate as one of our fundraisers.

We recently launched our Christmas Appeal, which together with donations made through the Giving Tree, allow us to prepare Christmas food and toy Hampers for the families we assist. This year we'll deliver these a bit over a week before Christmas Day, so the close off for your donations will be Sunday 16 December. The St Martin de Porres School also collects food and toys for us to help make up the hampers. We are most grateful for the support we receive from the parish and the school which allows us to continue delivering hampers to needy families in our area. Last year our hampers went to 39 adults and 47 children, an increase over the previous year.

While we are busy right now, it is the most rewarding time of year for us. Our spirits are lifted by the smiles and heartfelt thanks we receive when delivering Christmas hampers, making all the hard work our volunteers do throughout the year worthwhile.

The Hallett Cove Vinnies aims to be self-funding. We try to cover the costs of the assistance we give through your donations and the funds we raise from lottery ticket sales, the bookshop and our Winter and Christmas appeals.

We are fortunate that we also obtain food through Foodbank at reduced cost allowing us to continue our level of assistance.

New National Coordinator for Permanent Diaconate

Adelaide's Deacon Tim Grauel was recently appointed as national coordinator of the permanent diaconate for the Bishops Office for Clergy Life and Ministry.

The appointment was ratified in August by Australian Catholic Bishops Conference president Archbishop Mark Coleridge and Bishop Greg O'Kelly SJ, the apostolic administrator of the Archdiocese of Adelaide.

Fr Greg Bourke, executive secretary of the Bishops Commission for Church Ministry and director of its Office for Clergy Life and Ministry, said Australia had experienced a significant increase in the number of deacons.

"Deacons were in great numbers up until around the year 1000 and after then it declined gradually. There's differences of opinions on the reasons for this; however, since Vatican II, the diaconate has been revived and seen significant increases in vocations," he said.

St Stephen, the first martyr of the Church, and St Francis of Assisi, who lived 800 years ago, are two deacons in the very rich history of the diaconate, Fr Bourke said.

"The diaconate is at its best when the ministry is at the interface of the Church and the world, for example prison chaplaincy, emergency chaplains, police chaplains, and proclaiming and preaching the Gospel," he said.

"One quote often attributed to St Francis of Assisi that he said to his friars – preach well and preach effectively, and if you have to, use words – is still relevant today and supports the vision and purpose of the modern diaconate."

Deacon Grauel, a former senior manager for a major aged care organisation in Adelaide, said he was excited about the new role and looking forward to the challenge of promoting the permanent diaconate and encouraging sound formation and ongoing formation.

"I'm a relatively new deacon and was ordained just under three years ago, but I have a background as a minister with the Uniting Church," he said.

"I've embraced the challenge of being a deacon and see it as a bridge, both between the clergy and the laity, and between the Church and the world.

"There's a move for deacons to be almost entrepreneurial in the Church by encouraging the Gospel to reach different places and to be creative in doing that."
