KNIGHT'S NIGHTS

As previously mentioned in our parish bulletins and the Parish Newsletter, the Brighton/Marion/Hallett Cove/Glenelg Branch of the Knights of the Southern Cross meet every first Wednesday night of the month in the McAuley Room of the parish activity centre.



Besides formal aspects of meetings involving the universal Knight's prayers and reports from various office bearers last Wednesday's meeting, taking a leaf from the recent Parish Assembly, concentrated on what role the Knights might play in supporting the Brighton Parish Council's desire to foster a better community.

Led by Branch Chairman, Patrick Hodgson, in his ubiquitous style and brimming with ideas, discussions focussed on encouraging better and wider communication by the Knights with other groups in the parish for furthering the Parish Pastoral Council's objectives. Observations on points raised at the Parish Assembly followed with an emphasis on engaging with young people. Thoughts on fostering some kind of community drop in centre were canvassed, in respect of which it was hoped the Pastoral Council would always continue to examine ways of utilisation of assets rather than divestment as a first option.

Arrangements for a major social function: **A Crazy Whist Night**, to be held on Friday 8th November 2019, were finalised along with an attractive flyer to advertise it. The function hopes to be one means of helping wider community participation and also of raising funds for Vinnies and the local Antioch Youth Group and, as the blurb on the flyer says, be an enjoyable fun evening. And on the day it was just that, in Spades!

Over 70 people came along to the whist drive. A dozen or so were young ones. MCs Patrick and Damien of the Youth Group kept things moving with humorous anecdotes punctuated with tricky brain teasers. There were door prizes, someone sat on a lucky chair and the highest and lowest scores picked up a bottle or two of fine wines and chocolates and, of course, every one enjoyed the contributed generous supper. The night raised over \$500. Congratulations to the Knight's team that ran this very pleasant social evening – a sure formula for similar successful events.

Parish Finance Council Update

As we near the end of the current Financial Plan which ran from 2015 – 2019 the PFC is working with the leadership team to plan for our future.

Our loan has reduced significantly from \$145k in 2015 to the current balance of \$80k – much thanks to the Brighton Parish who have subsidised interest payments which helps immensely.

Our current income has continued to fall over the past few years, and expense and salaries have both increased which makes making ends meet very difficult.

There is also a number of expensive capital works including the roof which will need to be addressed shortly.

We have worked hard to retain our independence, and the PFC will continue to look at how we might reduce costs, this might mean less paid staff and more volunteers, a change in loan payments, and an increase in income from our Stewardship program which is due in 2020.

It is possible many of you have heard that the school is planning to expand, and a number of proposals are under consideration – we are looking at all options that we could leverage to ensure that the vibrant community that is Hallett Cove is fully supported.
